

Early Career Scholar Paper Award on Sustainability and Entrepreneurship

Early Career Scholar Paper Award in Sustainability and Entrepreneurship, sponsored by the Ewing Marion Kauffman Foundation, will support ONE early-career scholars in contributing to the research on sustainability and entrepreneurship. Specifically, it will (1) recognize promising early-career researcher in this area, and (2) encourage young scholars to forge a research agenda at the intersection of entrepreneurship and sustainability.

Submission requirements and selection process

The paper chosen for the award must be a paper published by a PhD student as a first author within 2-3 three years after the graduation. Applicants may nominate their own work or the work of another. A paper can only be nominated once. The submission cycle will begin in March of the year and the winner will be announced at the ONE Business Meeting at the Academy of Management conference in August.

The first author of the paper will have to be an early career researcher (i.e., doctoral student, postdoc doc, assistant professor) and member of ONE.

To nominate an article, submit the paper, along with a letter of nomination, which should include:

1. Full citation and author's contact information
2. Description of the paper's key contributions (theoretical and empirical) (max 150 words)
3. Potential implications for practice (max 150 words)

Two finalists and a winner will be selected by an award committee comprising ONE division leaders, senior scholars, and prior winners.

The winner will receive \$500 in cash and a plaque, totaling an amount of \$1000.
